The estate encompasses 600 lush tropical acres stretching over two valleys and bordering two soft sand beaches. In the valley behind Anse Mamin beach, guests can explore the historical ruins of an 18th century plantation.




ANSE MAMIN BEACH

Not only do you get a World Heritage Site anchored by the twin peaks on land, the resort's two crystal-clear bays are part of a designated marine reserve protecting miles of colorful coral reefs teeming with tropical fish.



Thirty-seven rooms tiptoe up a flower decked hillside. To make the most of the panoramic views and the refreshing tradewinds, octagonal whitewashed cottages come with wraparound flower draped balconies and louvered windows.

Spacious Hillside Deluxe and Premium rooms underscore the visionary, innovative, sometimes whimsical side of Nick Troubetzkoy: in one suite, the balcony is built around a full-grown red gommier tree; in another a flamboyant tree drapes its red blossoms around the balcony. Some have their 4th wall open entirely to the vistas, yet are completely private.



A dozen rooms are tucked in behind the coconut palms that line the Anse Chastanet beach. These are the air-conditioned beachside deluxe rooms, facing a tropical garden and only steps away from the water's edge.



BEACHSIDE DELUXE ROOM



*A*nse Chastanet's one-of-a-kind Casuarina suite features a brand new 160 square-foot pool surrounded by a 135-square foot deck in the middle of the hillside resort with its breathtaking views of the storied Piton mountains and the surrounding azure waters. The suite can be inter-connected with an additional bedroom.





The one-of-a-kind Beach House suite is located on the north corner of Anse Chastanet beach where you can sit and relax, looking out over the sparkling Caribbean Sea, watching sunsets year round from your elevated brick deck in the landscaped oceanfront garden. The interior is bright and airy, bathed in warm Caribbean sunlight shining through its French doors and windows.



Whether you fancy fine tropical Caribbean Cuisine, exotic Creole flavors, or simple grilled fare, you will find it available and more. Our culinary options also include our St. Lucia-Indian menu titled Apsara, a wholly vegetarian restaurant called Emerald's and last but not least our Jungle Grill for day time laid back dining on our second beach Anse Mamin. And of course, all of our kitchen receive organic produce from our resort farm Emerald's in the Soufriere hills.

The old French Colonial plantation of Anse Mamin is located directly behind Anse Mamin beach, a tropical garden of Eden with historical ruins dating back to the 18th century. The Anse Mamin plantation can be visited with one of the estate guides for a guided tour or guests can visit the plantation early morning or late afternoon for jogging on the estate trails.

S CUBA ST. LUCIA is Anse Chastanet's PADI 5 Star Dive Operation located at the south end of ANSE CHASTANET beach. Scuba St. Lucia offers great diving and comprehensive facilities for divers of all levels. Beach and boat diving are offered daily with most dive sites within an easy 5-15 minute range. The Anse Chastanet reef starts just 10 yards beyond the water's edge. The reef's remarkable ecosystem offers an amazing profusion of unusual tropical marine life, in 20 to 140 feet of calm, clear water.
